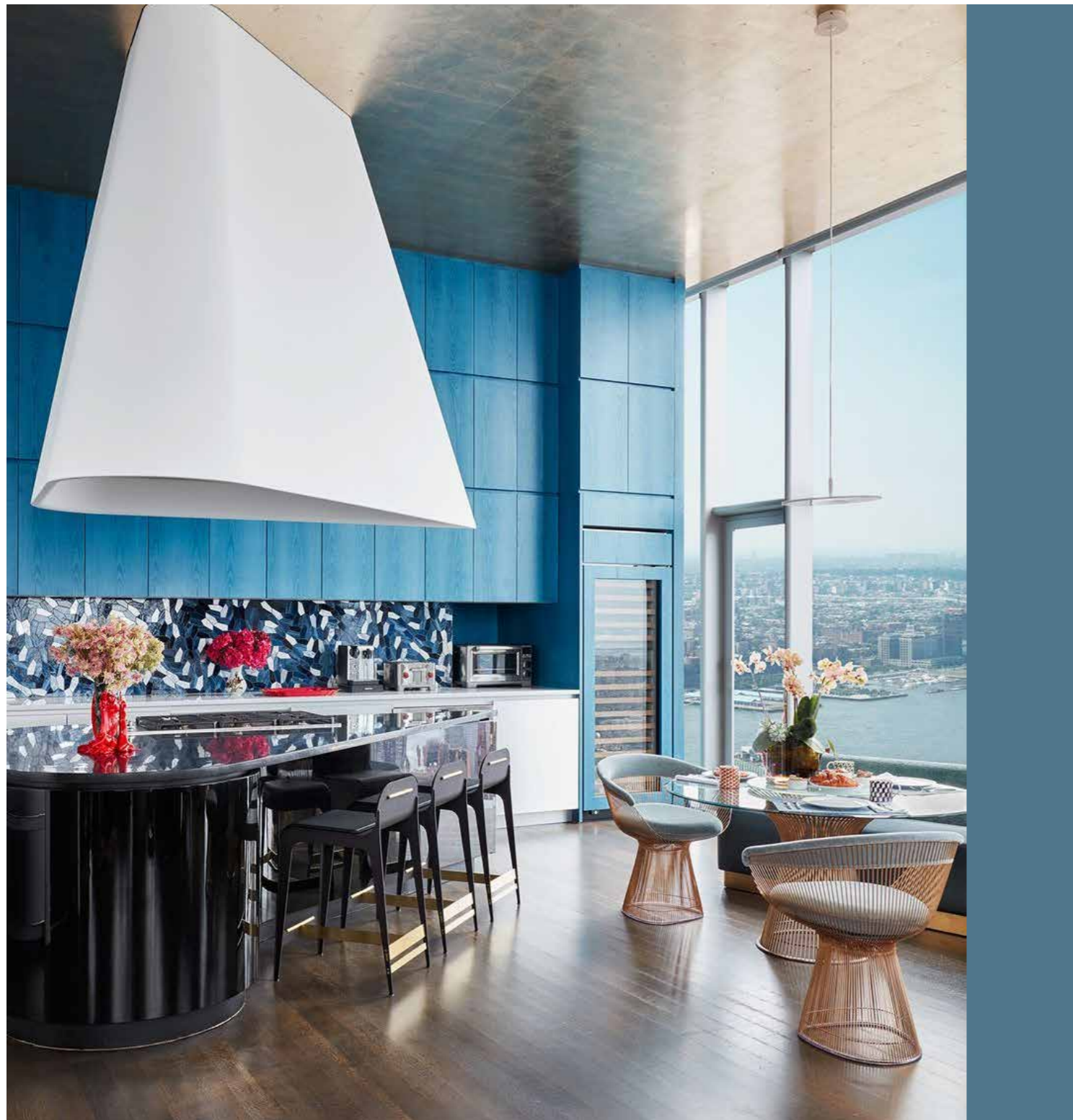
PEPPER GRANITE

A Melbourne, Australia home makes the most of an open-concept space with a streamlined island crafted of pepper granite.



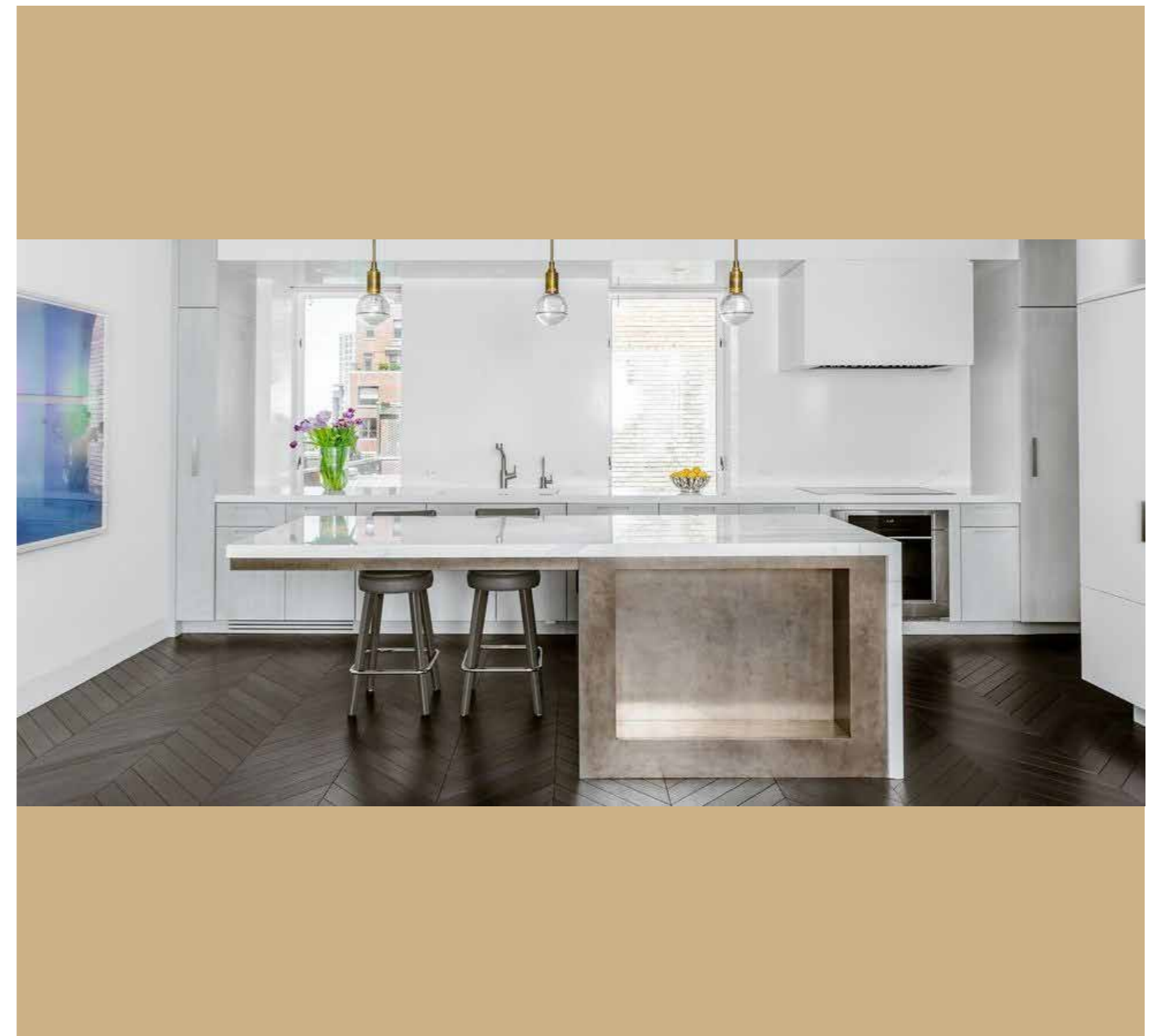
WALNUT VENEER ISLAND

A modern Mexican treehouse kitchen makes the most of the space's sleek architecture with an intuitive custom island topped with modern Caesarstone.



RECLAIMED WOOD ISLAND

A rustic-modern vineyard estate by Amy A. Alper, Architect and Jennifer Robin Interiors takes advantage of bright and airy spaces, fashioning this open kitchen with reclaimed wood, including the island which is topped with concrete for durability.



GRAY MARBLE KITCHEN ISLAND

A black and white kitchen in a contemporary Los Angeles home designed by Georgia Tapert Howe is complete with a gray marble island, a refrigerator by Sub-Zero, a range by Wolf, and a Rohl farmhouse sink with fittings by Waterworks.

SLEEK, WHITE MARBLE KITCHEN ISLAND

A white marble island adds contrast to a New York condo kitchen that's outfitted with black marble, black stools and cabinets.



CLASSIC KITCHEN ISLAND

Along with a marble and grey island, the kitchen of a Washington, Connecticut, farmhouse includes stools by York Street Studio, a Wolf range, Waterworks sink fittings, and walls painted in Benjamin Moore's White Dove.



HAGUE BLUE KITCHEN ISLAND

In this Hollywood Hills home, the kitchen features vintage pendants from Obsolete and BassamFellows stools from Design Within Reach. The island and cabinets are painted in Farrow & Ball's Hague Blue.





MAJESTIC BLUE KITCHEN ISLAND

Open Staircase

Rise to the occasion with a modern design dream.

While a new staircase often falls to the bottom of most homeowners' renovation wishlists, the decision to switch it up can create major impact within your interior design scheme. Stairs with traditional



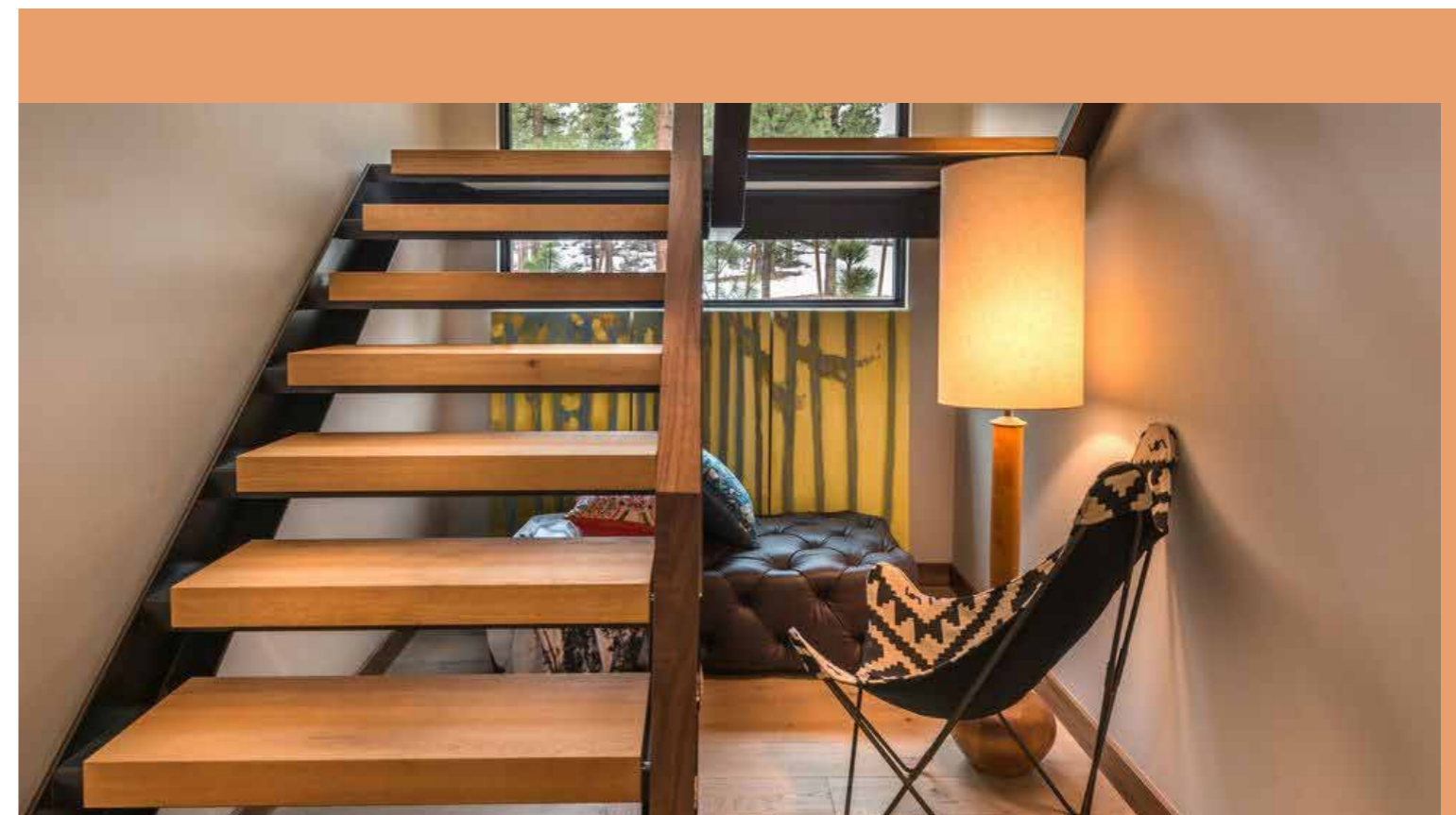
risers can create a dense, clunky look in the home, obstructing the natural flow of any given space. Open stairs—A.K.A. stairs without risers, in which treads are visible from above and below—offer an eye-catching alternative that feels light, airy, and unobtrusive.

SUSPENSION CABLES AND WOOD SLATS

Metal suspension cables and wood slats make up this whimsical ski chalet staircase, blending in with the home's wood-clad design.



TWO-TONED WOOD

This two-tone open staircase by Scott Corridan Design allows plenty of light to flow through to the below sitting area.

STAINLESS STEEL AND GLASS

In a glamorous Manhattan duplex, a custom-made Swarovski-crystal light fixture hangs above an open stainless steel-and-glass staircase.



ROUGH-HEWN WOOD

In an 1870s farm in Bedford, New York, interior designer Virginia Tupker embraces the rustic farmhouse aesthetic with an open staircase made from rough-hewn wood.



STEEL FINNS

For Matt Berman and Andrew Kotchen's high-tech Manhattan design project, the staircase is integrated into the bookshelf with a series of steel fins. The bookshelf dividers form the stair treads and structure of the above mezzanine.



FLOATING WOOD STAIRS

Block-like floating stairs—suspended from a thin wire—play into this loft’s cozy Scandinavian aesthetic, while keeping the small space open and airy.



BRASS AND WOOD

In former fashion CEO Beth Bugdaycay’s sprawling TriBeCa duplex, a custom staircase in brass and wood leads up to the bedrooms.



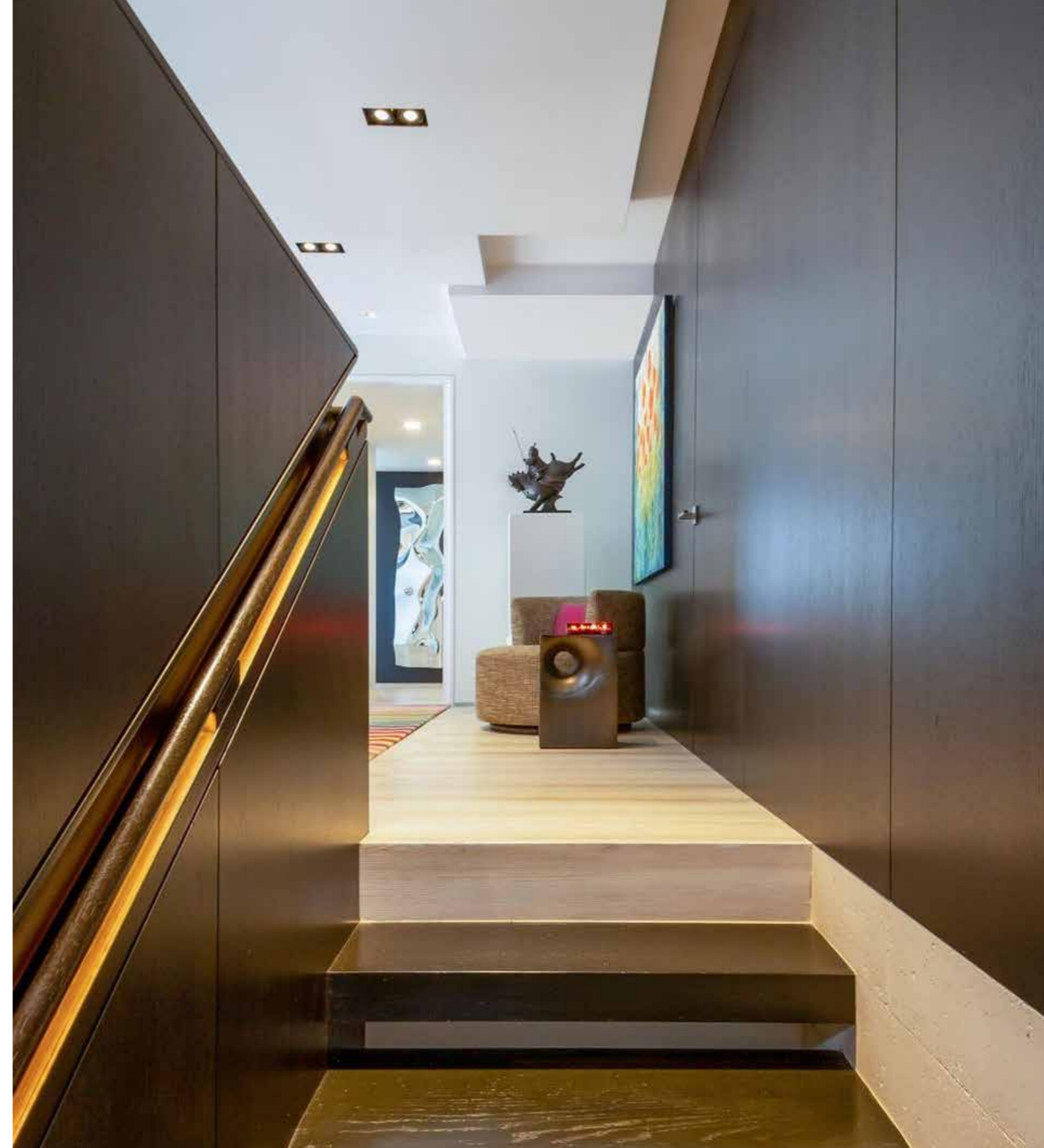
POLISHED WHITE CONCRETE AND GLASS

A floating window box design by Blaze Makoid Architecture is clad in afromosia wood, creating a gorgeous contrast against the polished white concrete and glass staircase.



STEEL, NICKEL, AND TIMBER

For the entryway of a Victorian townhouse in London's Notting Hill neighborhood, designers Timothy Haynes and Kevin Roberts installed a custom open staircase made of steel, nickel, and treated timber, topped with a pale gray runner to complete the look.



STAINED WOOD AND CONCRETE

Clean lines take center stage in this Eolo A&I-designed Miami penthouse, with an open staircase crafted of dark stained wood against concrete bricks.

WITH BOLD DESIGN CHOICES



SCANDINAVIAN-INSPIRED LIVING ROOM

Luxury hotels and modern Scandinavian style informed the aesthetic of Swedish it-girl Babba C. Rivera's Brooklyn Heights living room. "I love the mid-century era—a lot of my furniture is mid-century modern—which I balance with contemporary touches so it's not too vintage looking," Rivera says.



LAKE HOUSE LIVING ROOM

Wicker disks serve as a focal point in designer Sabrina Albanese's living room. In addition to a custom sofa by Robert Allen with cushions in a Schumacher fabric, the rug is Miles Redd for Patterson Flynn Martin.

LAYERED LIVING ROOM

In a Marfa, Texas, home, a living room with a layered aesthetic includes a Poul Henningsen light fixture, a Navajo rug, and a cabinet by Robert "Mouseman" Thompson that holds an Ansel Adams photograph. The walls are painted in Benjamin Moore's Cloud White.



BROOKLYN BROWNSTONE LIVING ROOM

A Fedele Papagni chandelier from Donzella, which hangs above a custom Vladimir Kagan sofa, completes this living room design by decorator Elizabeth Roberts. Chartreuse-colored curtains in an Elitis's Poeme fabric, and artworks by Olafur Eliasson and Kehinde Wiley enhance the design scheme.





NEUTRAL LIVING ROOM

In the living room of Kate and Rem Reynolds's townhouse in Windsor Terrace, Brooklyn, the sofa from ABC Carpet & Home is upholstered in a fabric by Soraya Shah for Studio Four NYC, the design showroom Kate Reynolds co-owns.



OPEN-AIR LIVING ROOM

At the top of the tower of a Florence manor, with 360-degree views of the Apennine Mountains, a living room contains a vintage sofa and custom daybeds covered in fabrics by C&C Milano.



ALCOVE LIVING ROOM

In a San Francisco loft, the sofa inspired by Donald Judd has cushions covered in a Schumacher linen, the steel cocktail and side tables are custom designs, the vintage floor lamp is Danish, the paintings, from left, are by Howard Hodgkin and Conrad Marca-Relli.



MIDCENTURY-INSPIRED

In the West Village pied-à-terre of Los Angeles-based designers Waldo Fernandez and Tommy Clements, the daybed is by Rick Owens, armchairs by Émile-Jacques Ruhlmann are upholstered in an alpaca by Perrine Rousseau.

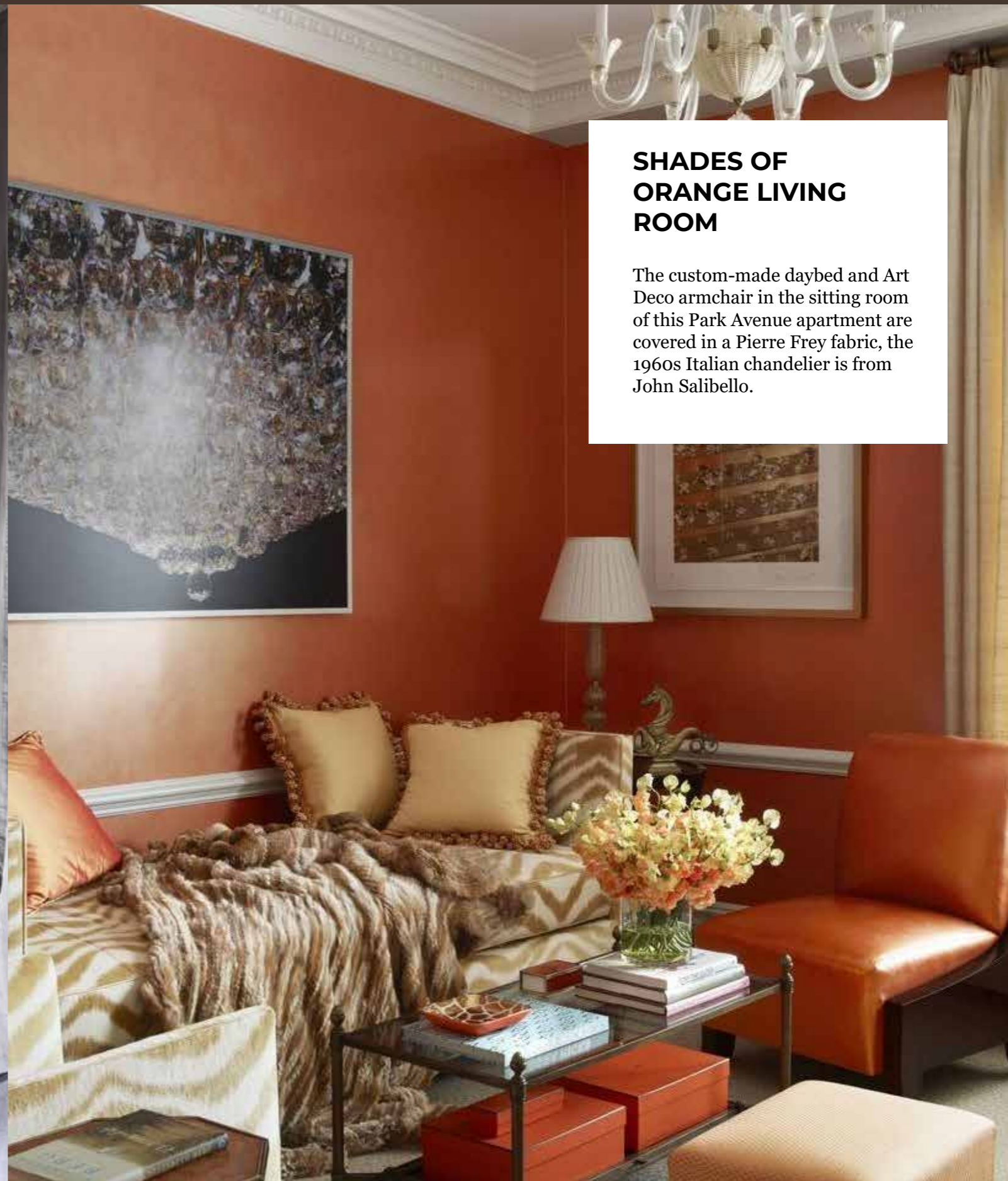
NARROW LIVING ROOM

A gouache by McIntosh and a custom-made banquette outfit the sitting area of this Moroccan riad; the cushions's cotton-canvas fabric was found in a souk, as was the painted side table; the pendant and sconces are by maisonLAB, the walls are painted in Farrow & Ball's Lamp Room Gray, and black-painted cement tiles line the floor.

CALMING GRAY

A mix of gray tones contribute to this master bedroom's soothing effect. The Upper West Side space, which was designed by Brad Ford, includes a custom bed in a deep gray Brochier fabric, and wallpaper by Wolf-Gordon. The artwork is by Erin Shirreff.



TRANQUIL GRAY

For the master bedroom in a Chicago home, interior designer Elizabeth Krueger chose a subtle grey silk wallpaper and custom metal barn doors with brass screwhead accents. To finish the design, Krueger selected a light grey upholstered headboard and deep grey bedding.



LUXE GRAY

Layers of texture and a gray palette add warmth to this cozy bedroom design. A brass wall sculpture pulls the look together.



GRAY MEETS BLUE

Highlights of the master bedroom in a Miami penthouse include a custom standing lamp and headboard featuring an Aldeco pattern, as well as a grey coverlet in a Kirkby Design fabric. The armchair is 17th-century Spanish, the mirror is by R&Y Augousti, and the carpet is by Toulemonde Bochart.



WELCOMING GRAY

An Alex Papachristidis-designed Manhattan apartment features a master bedroom with walls sheathed in a grey Rubelli cotton velvet. The bed is upholstered in a Holly Hunt silk and dressed in Schweitzer linens.

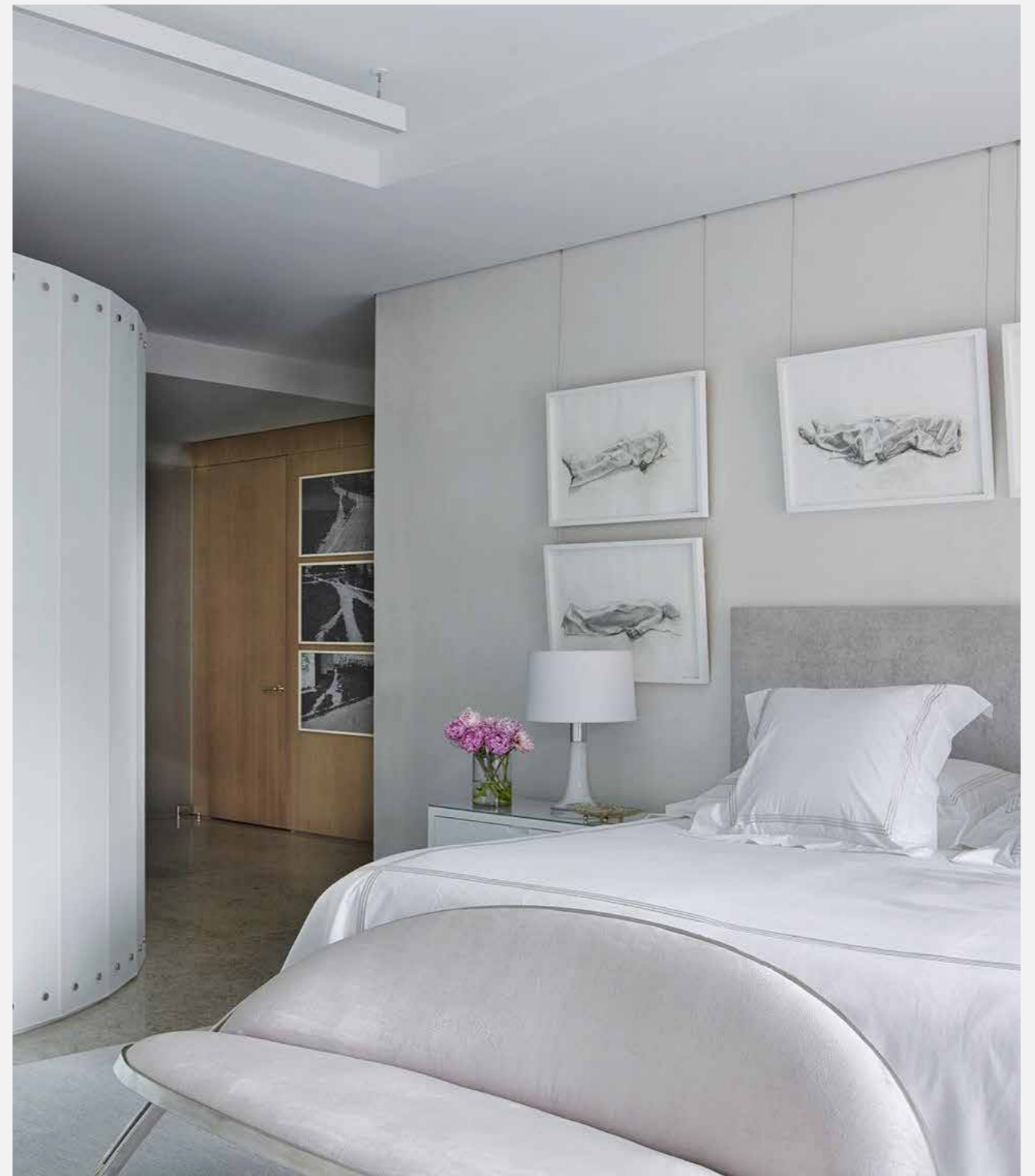
SOOTHING GRAYS

LIGHT GRAY

STYLISH MID-CENTURY

A modern living room with mid-century modern decor. Sleek, simple, and iconic.

The mid-century modern style of interior design was popularized during the 1940s, and has yet to leave the mainstream gaze—for good reason. Defined by clean lines, organic forms, minimal ornamentation, and high functionality, the style has an undeniably timeless appeal. Icons like Florence Knoll and Arne Jacobson—both of whom were prominent designers during the mid-century modern period—remain a strong part of the design conversation to this day, and their work still serves as inspiration for some of the world's top creatives. While some homeowners will commit to a fully mid-century modern home, anyone can easily infuse this look into their living rooms with a few simple tweaks.

WEST VILLAGE ELEGANCE

In the living room of this Nicole Fuller-designed pied-à-terre, the prewar architecture was given a contemporary twist with mid-century modern furnishings and decor—in a calming palette of blues and purples—bringing a sense of serenity to the space.



FLAGSTONE AND VELVET INDOOR-OUTDOOR ROOM

The mirrored side table in the living area of this Sierra Nevada Mountains home is by Notre Monde, and the fireplace surround is stacked flagstone.





MID-CENTURY CONTEMPORARY

Inspired by Philip Johnson's Glass House and Mies van der Rohe's Farnsworth house, design firm Drake/Anderson fashioned this upstate NY home with mid-century modern furnishings that play into the home's contemporary architecture.



◀ CURVED LINES

The living room in jazz pianist Dave Brubeck's Connecticut home features natural stone for the interior stairs, with original mid-century modern light fixtures and furnishings, all of which boast an organic curvature.

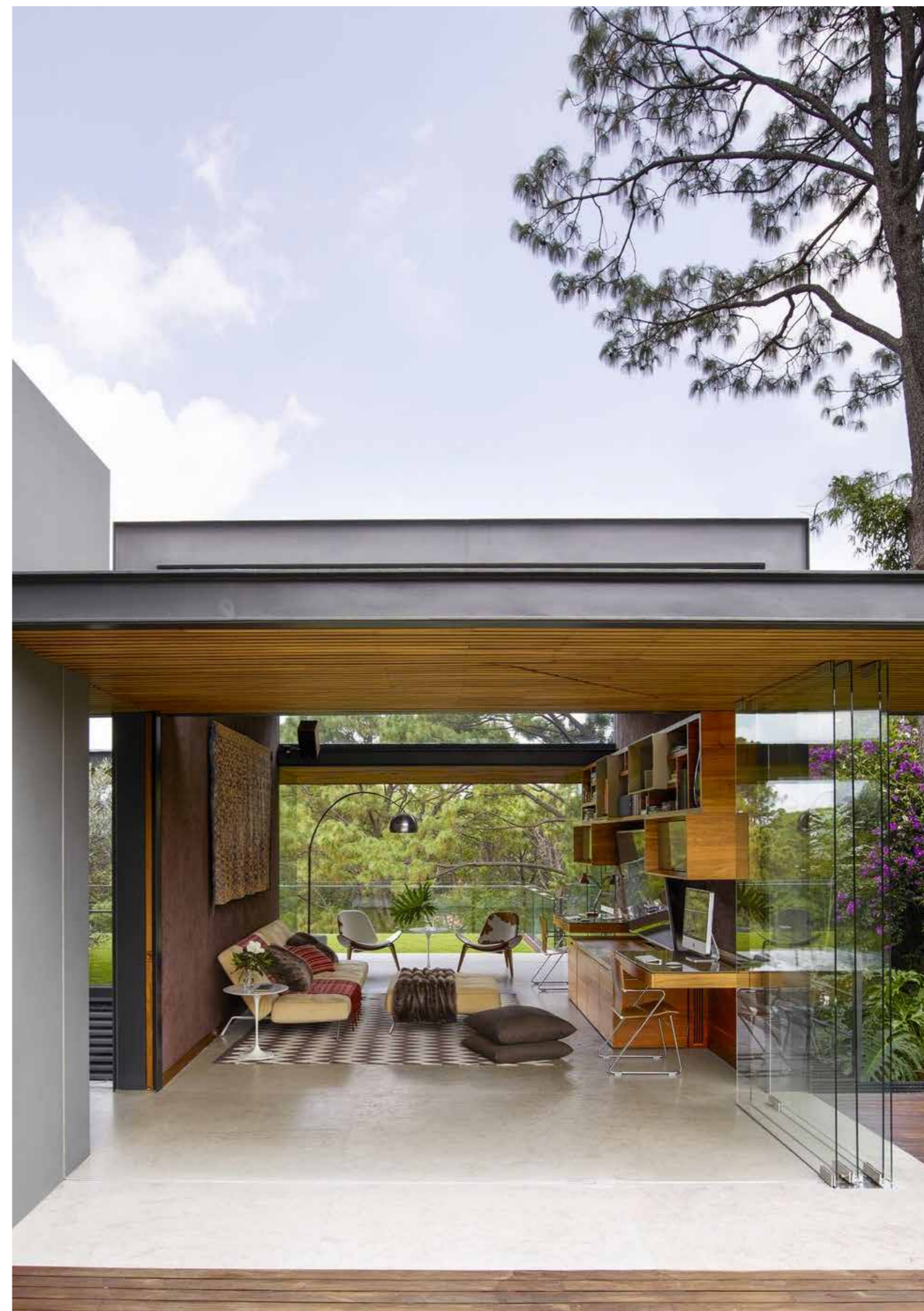
MODERN TREE HOUSE ▶
